Daniela Vitiello is the Principal Investigator of the Research Project of National Interest (PRIN 2022) entitled "Towards A European Model of Community Sponsorship for Refugees: Access, Reception and Integration", acronym CoSME (Community Sponsorship for Migrants in Europe).

She is also in charge of the Work Package no. 3 of the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on the Integration of Migrants in Europe (IntoME) and founder/co-director of the #UNITUS4Refugees network. Daniela is a tenure track assistant professor of EU law at the University of Tuscia, where she teaches EU law and EU migration and asylum law and policy.

She is also Departmental Delegate for Quality of Teaching and Placement, co-delegate of the Rector of the Network of Italian Universities for Peace (RUNIPACE) and Vice-President of the Association "Amici di Giurisprudenza".

Dr Vitiello has written extensively on the European Union's area of freedom, security and justice and is the author of a monograph on the role of the Frontex Agency in the integrated management of the Union's external borders.

She is a member of the editorial board of several journals and blogs in the field, including European Papers, Roma Tre Law Review, SIDIblog and ADiM Blog, and scientific coordinator of the jurisprudential review of the Associazione Italiana Studiosi di Diritto dell'Unione Europea (AISDUE).
