PROTECTED ENTRY PROCEDURES: PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE SCENARIOS

A Summer Training School (STS) gathering leading scholars and experts to provide participants with a theoretical and practical knowledge of the different systems of legal access routes for asylum purposes.

The STS on *Protected Entry Procedures: Past, Present and Future Scenarios* is a 5-days intensive course on the legal concerns and the socio-political implications of the lack or insufficiency of legal pathways to access asylum in Europe and elsewhere. Organised by the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on the Integration of Migrants in Europe (IntoME), it takes place at Tuscia University in Viterbo, providing an extensive and thorough understanding of past, present and future issues and challenges relating to protected entry procedure with a multi-level focus: national (in selected countries), regional (focusing mostly but not exclusively on the EU legal framework) and international (UNHCR and IOM led-initiatives). The STS is structured to enable participants to acquire both theoretical and empirical knowledge: the former through lectures delivered by experts and guest speakers in the morning, the latter via training sessions, workshops and brainstorming activities organized in the afternoon. This formula is enriched with a cine-debate taking place twice during the week: movies on important aspects of the migration process will be screened, followed by an informal discussion and an aperitif.

TARGET GROUPS

Master's and PhD students, Erasmus and international students, practitioners in the field of migration studies. The STS activities will take place in hybrid mode to allow participation both in person and online.

FEES

Participation in the School is subject to a fee of 200 euros. This includes teaching and learning materials, documentation, and the final certification of attendance and completion of the school. The fee does not cover travel and accommodation expenses, which participants bear on their own.
