Daniela Vitiello is the Principal Investigator of the Research Project of National Interest (PRIN 2022) entitled "Towards A European Model of Community Sponsorship for Refugees: Access, Reception and Integration", acronym CoSME (Community Sponsorship for Migrants in Europe).

She is also WP Leader of the Work Package N. 3: "Debating Integration Keys for Europe" (DIKE) of the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence on Integration of Migrants in Europe (IntoME), co-convenor of the ESIL Interest Group on Migration and Refugee Law (MigRefLaw) and founder/co-director of the #UNITUS4Refugees network.

Daniela is an Associate Professor of EU law at the University of Tuscia, where she teaches the courses of EU law (in Italian), Human Mobility (in English), and coordinates the UNITUS Migration and Asylum Legal Clinic (MALC).

Daniela Vitiello is the Programme Coordinator of the UNITUS International Master's Degree in European Studies on "Security and Human Rights", delegate of the Rector for the UNHCR-led UNICORE project (University Corridors for Refugees) and co-delegate of the Rector for the Network of Italian Universities for Peace (RUNIPACE). She has written extensively on the European Union's area of freedom, security and justice and is the author of a monograph on the role of the Frontex Agency in the integrated management of the Union's external borders.

She is a member of the editorial board of several journals and blogs in the field, including European Papers, Roma Tre Law Review, SIDiblog and ADiM Blog, and scientific coordinator of the jurisprudential review of the Associazione Italiana Studiosi di Diritto dell'Unione Europea (AISDUE).
